Allegation	<p>A positive assertion especially of misconduct; a statement by a party to a legal action of what the party undertakes to prove; an assertion unsupported and by implication regarded as unsupportable. (Merriam-Webster)</p> <p>In law, an allegation is a claim of a fact by a party in a pleading, charge, or defense. Until they can be proved, allegations remain merely assertions. (Wikipedia)</p>
Alternative Right (Alt-Right)	The alt-right, or alternative right, is a loosely connected far-right, white nationalist movement. The term is ill-defined, having been used in different ways by various groups and individuals. (Wikipedia)

Neo-Nazism	Neo-Nazism consists of post-World War II militant social or political movements seeking to revive and implement the ideology of Nazism. Neo-Nazis seek to employ their ideology to promote hatred and attack minorities, or in some cases to create a fascist political state. (Wikipedia)

Supremacism	<p>An ideology which holds that a certain class of people is superior to others, and that they should dominate, control, and subjugate others, or are entitled to do so</p> <p>The supposed superior people can be an age, race (classification of human beings) species, ethnicity, religion, gender (social construct), sexuality, language, social class, ideology, nation, or culture, or any other part of a population. Supremacy (Racial)	The belief that some particular group or race is superior to all others (freedictionary)
Supremacy (White)	<p>White supremacy or white supremacism is a racist ideology based upon the belief that white people are superior in many ways to people of other races and that therefore white people should be dominant over other races.</p> <p>White supremacy has roots in scientific racism and it often relies on pseudoscientific arguments. Like most similar movements such as neo-Nazism, white supremacists typically oppose members of other races as well as Jews. (Wikipedia)</p>

Völkisch (ethnic)	Völkisch is an adjective that is a derivative of the people . Since the end of the 19th century, the term has gained importance in everyday language, the media and politics. From the middle of the 20th century the word was used there less often, but since the rise of corresponding movements in Germany

	<p>and Austria to their description in recent time again increasingly used. As a loan word , the term was adopted in English.</p> <p>In its modern version, Völkisch transports a racist concept of the people, which in particular also includes anti-Semitism . It was adopted in the German-speaking world as a self-designation of the nationalist movement and became a key concept of nationalist nationalism . Also individual politicians of the AfD expressed themselves for a rehabilitation of the term Völkisch .</p> <p>Offside right-wing populist and right-wing extremist circles is negatively connoted völkisch . The suffix -isch contains Günter Hartung According to a pejorative component as -lich in national terms does not contain (cf .: childish - childish ). (Wikipedia)</p>
