### Indiana Persimmon Pudding

Preheat oven to 325 degrees and grease 13 x 9 inch baking dish. Using a large bowl, combine:

- 1-1/2 cups flour
- 1 cup white sugar
- 1 cup packed brown sugar dark
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1/8 teaspoon salt

Using another large bowl, whisk or beat together:

- 2 cups mashed persimmon pulp
- 1-1/2 cups buttermilk
- 3 room temperature eggs
- 1/4 cup melted butter
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1 teaspoon maple syrup or flavoring

Stir wet ingredients into dry ingredients. Pour into the 13x9" pan. Bake 40-45 minutes or until pudding begins to pull away from the sides of pan and center is firm. Best served warm with whipped cream. Yum!


### **American Persimmon Trees**




Look at the jump in early/mail-in voting increases since 2012. It has tripled and is still being pushed across the state. Ask yourself, why? Ease for voters or something else?



Looking at above graph, It is remarkable that the light and dark blue lines are, almost perfectly, one on top of the other. The light blue line is a calculation using Johnson County turnout by age applied to registered Brown County Voters by age (red line). Yet, this calculation almost perfectly matches Brown County's Ballots Cast by age in dark blue. Are formulaic election results believable?

R=0.996 is a calculation that shows how perfectly the two blue lines match. 1.0 would be perfect. Human behavior is typically in the 0.6 range. Take away: These results do not reflect normal human behavior.

Indiana First Action produced and replicated this analysis on 25 Indiana counties and concluded that election results indicate a controlled system.
