# The Home Energy Rebate Programs

Empowering Hoosiers to Enhance Home Energy Efficiency

#### **Program Overview**

- \$8.8 billion is allocated for the Home Energy Rebate programs by federal legislation signed into law on August 16, 2022.
- Indiana has been allocated approximately \$182 million from federal funds under the U.S. Department of Energy.
- The initiative aims to assist Indiana residents in reducing energy costs through energy efficiency improvements.

### Two distinct programs:


#### **Home Efficiency Rebate Program (HOMES)**

Whole-home retrofits to enhance energy efficiency.

#### **Home Appliance Rebate Program (HEAR)**

Installation of new appliances that use less energy.





### Home Efficiency Rebate Program (HOMES)

**Focus:** Achieve energy savings targets through whole-home retrofits.

### **Eligible Upgrades:**

 Whole-Home Retrofits: Includes air sealing, insulation, HVAC systems, water heaters and other energy efficiency improvements.

### **Program Eligibility:**


- Available to all households with higher rebate offerings for low-income households.
- Applicable to both single-family and multifamily residential units.

### Home Appliance Rebate Program (HEAR)

Focus: Maximum rebate amounts for energy efficient appliances.

#### **Eligible Upgrades:**

- Equipment: Includes heat pump water heaters, heat pump HVAC, electric stoves, and heat pump clothes dryers.
- Electrical Upgrades: Eligibility extends to crucial electrical system enhancements such as service load centers/panels, and electrical wiring.

### **Program Eligibility**

- o Tailored specifically for low- and moderate-income households (earning less than 150% of Area Median Income).
- Applicable to both single-family and multifamily residential units.
